Doubt, Grace, Storms & Rocks




A few years ago, I was at Lightening in a Bottle, a modern-day Woodstock held annually in California. As I strolled from venue to venue, I happened to stop at a vendor's booth filled with various wooden carvings. The one that said, "I like you just the way you are" caught my eye, as if it was a flashing neon sign from God, an updated version of the old hymn "Just as I Am."

I brought it home to add to my favorite piece of pottery, an intentionally misshapen bowl. Full of rocks from my travels, assorted prayer beads, and other ordinary objects that have carried Divine messages over the years, it is part of an "altar," where I go to still the chaos of my mind and the world and to listen for affirmations that "All Shall Be Well".

Those of you who have been around for a while may recall a local celebrity weatherman named Bill Powell. Bill was a folksy, bald, everyman sort who was much loved, despite the fact he would have a hard time making it in the glitzy world of television today. He had a way of sharing nuggets of wisdom along with the weather forecast whether stormy or sunny. He signed off each day with this benediction, "Everybody's got their own sack of rocks to tote around."

In a recent sermon Sara preached on doubt, she bravely self-identified as a doubting Thomas. She then invited all of us to share our own doubts on an index card and place them on the altar during communion. Later she shared her surprise at the number of folks who expressed their doubt as not being "enough," despite her weekly benediction that we are all beloved children of God worthy of love and respect and through whom God will change the world.

The "not enough" mantra is a sack of rocks many of us tote around beneath a façade of faith and confidence. Could it be that in our unexpressed doubts about our faith, we quickly grab for the "I'm not enough" explanation?



Throughout Lent and beyond a wonderfully courageous group journeyed through the book, Falling Upward by Richard Rohr, as we learned and shared what it means to cultivate a mature faith. Rohr writes, "One of the markers of an evolving faith is an ability to integrate doubt—to hold the tension between what we've been taught and what we've come to know as true. When grounded in an experience of Love, doubt does not represent a step backwards, but is a necessary condition for any movement forward."

To be honest, the older I get, the less I am certain about most things. Perhaps we must release our death grip on certainty, our demand for it, to experience the power and mystery of God's grace that allows us not only to hear we are beloved but to truly believe it.

P.S. "I like you just the way you are" and that is precisely where God meets us all.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM Shepherding Ministry Centenary Church

Centenary seeks to build community, to know and serve God and to support one another in this journey of life. Everyone is a cherished child of God worthy of respect, acceptance and love. Shepherding is a style of discipleship that offers and provides care to God's people. Many of us can give the gift of our experience, strength, and hope to those in transition. We can be/are a powerful tool to help our transitional housing participant to discover how to unlock and achieve his potential—to live a life of stability, free of drugs and alcohol abuse and to become self-sufficient.

Each participant will be placed with a shepherd selected from our faith community to assist them through this period of transformation. The shepherds will be informed to understand and prepare for their role and responsibilities. Then, throughout the relationship, ongoing support will be given from the Outreach staff.

A shepherd is a caring, loving individual who is concerned with the well-being and safety of others. He/ she is a good listener, committed and responsible, respectful, and able to be a part of a team. A shepherd's role is to help the participant to achieve their potential and discover the success of a transformed life through God's grace. A shepherd is not to make decisions for the participant. Instead, he/she will listen, encourage and guide them to find positive solutions to issues, while assisting them in setting goals, assisting in making healthy choices, and offering advice when a different perspective is needed. Shepherds will celebrate successes and help their participants discover unique gifts and talents they possess.

A participant's primary role is to be totally committed to transforming his/her life. They must be motivated to reach for a different type of life and they must exhibit a desire to break the cycle of poverty and be willing to work. The participant must be willing to work with a role-model and able to receive support along with candid feedback. They must be accountable to their assigned shepherd. Through the shepherding program, a mutual trust, love and respect will be developed; thus, a significant progress will be made toward completing the participant's goal.




community. When Jen isn't working, you can often find her an active participant in numerous social and personal growth groups, where she engages in a multitude of activities including contemplative practices, book
